

# 2024 Spenard Capital Improvement Program (CIP) Priorities Survey Information



## What is the CIP Priorities Survey?

- The CIP Priorities Survey is a tool used by Municipality of Anchorage staff to assess the proposed capital project needs in Anchorage.

## How does it work?

- Each spring the Mayor of Anchorage sends a letter to community councils requesting their list of priorities for the Capital Improvement Program.
- As this is a request that may require contemplation, we wanted to give residents enough time to determine what their priorities may be.
- We, the Spenard Community Council Executive Board, will send a link to an online survey to residents before our next regular meeting.
- Residents will have approximately one month to complete the survey.
- The SCC Executive Board will compile results and have a list of priorities determined by survey results ready to vote on at the SCC regular meeting held on **Wednesday, May 3**.
- If approved, the SCC president will upload the priorities to the municipal website.

## What kinds of projects should I suggest?

- Think big! You don't have to have all the details worked out.
- Listed below are the top 10 (out of 25) 2022 Spenard CIP priorities to help you think of additional projects or remind you of previously discussed projects:
  1. Fish Creek daylighting: bring it out of culverts as a free-flowing creek
  2. Pedestrian Crossings/Traffic Calming: Minnesota Boulevard from International to Northern Lights Boulevard
  3. Chugach Way Upgrade - Spenard Rd to Arctic Blvd
  4. Lois Dr Upgrade - Northern Lights Blvd to 36th Ave road, sidewalks, storm drainage, etc.
  5. 36th Ave Upgrade - Lois Dr to Minnesota Dr: surface, sidewalks, drainage, etc.
  6. Community Garden Site Selection and Design and Management Standards
  7. Spenard Rd Reconstruction Phase III - 30th Ave to Northwood Dr
  8. Spenard Rd Rehabilitation - Benson Blvd to Minnesota Dr
  9. Woodland Park Safety Improvements
  10. Waste and Recycling Bins on Spenard Road - Minnesota Blvd
