Parks & Recreation

Anchorage has 10,946 acres of municipal parkland, 223 parks, and over 250 miles of trails and greenbelts that link neighborhoods with surrounding natural open space and wildlife habitat. These are considerable assets for the citizens of Anchorage to enjoy and maintain.

Parks & Recreation launched the *Clean & Green, Safe & Secure Campaign* with the Anchorage Park Foundation to upgrade the safety, function, and appearance of Anchorage parks. To get involved, call 343-4288.

Section 36 is a parcel of land located in the Southeast Park District, which has the largest concentration of natural use areas and the lowest number of developed parks in the Anchorage Bowl. Expected population growth over the next fifteen years will increase the level of parks and recreation services needed to meet future demands.

Section 36 is currently held in the Municipal Heritage Land Bank and existing bond money is being used to complete a master plan for the 600 acre park. Section 36 will be transferred to Parks and Recreation when the master plan is complete and when funds are identified for maintenance and management if the park.

The State funds requested will be used to implement improvement projects identified in the Section 36 Master Plan, which is currently being developed through a community involvement process.
