Reminder for Anchorage Caucus Meeting

Saturday, February 18th, 10 am-noon, is the annual Anchorage Caucus Meeting at the Anchorage Loussac Library — Assembly Chambers. This is a great opportunity for you to talk to your Anchorage Senators and Representatives about the issues most important to you and your family.

Senator Ellis and Senate colleagues this week held a 'Q & A' with school districts from across the state. The Butrovich Room was filled to capacity with school district representatives and legislators discussing the challenges school districts are facing. Last week, the [Senate voted to help improve our schools by modestly increasing the Base Student Allocation](#).

Oil & Gas Tax Expert Advised Senate Finance Committee

The Senate Finance Committee heard two days of testimony from international oil and gas tax expert [Dr. Pedro Van Meurs](#) this week. He described in detail how the big three oil companies are in “harvesting mode”—taking as much profit as possible out of Alaska to fuel their operations elsewhere. Dr. Van Meurs’ testimony made it perfectly clear that passing the Governor’s oil tax bill (HB110) would have been a huge mistake, and Senate President Gary Stevens (R-Kodiak) went so far as to say that Van Meurs’ implied HB110 would be a “disaster.” I am proud the Senate Bipartisan Working Group had the leadership and fortitude to say “No, we need more information,” when the Governor’s bill came before us last session.

We learned a lot from Dr. Van Meurs. Contrary to what you may hear from the other sources, Dr. Van Meurs stated that Alaska’s taxes on existing oil production “compare favorably” with other Arctic nations (#9 out of 28). While his research shows that our tax on existing production is competitive, he encouraged us to offer tax incentives for new oil, heavy oil, ultra-heavy oil, shale oil, and natural gas. He also suggested that Alaska’s exploration and capital credits may be overly generous. These are the issues we will be working on.

Dr. Van Meurs is just one of three consultants advising the Senate as we do the careful analysis required to improve our oil tax system. Wood Mackenzie and PFC Energy, both highly

respected international consultancies, will be offering their analysis as well. I am 100% confident that the Senate will take action this session on a thoroughly researched and well-crafted piece of oil tax legislation that ensures oil profits are fairly shared between the State and the Industry.

Suicide Prevention

This past Wednesday, staffers from the [National Conference of State Legislatures](#) spoke to legislators and staff about the alarming rate of suicide in Alaska and what we as policymakers can do to prevent future suicides. Through building awareness and educating our community on risk factors and the resources at their disposal, we can work together to prevent these tragedies. As a board member of the Alaska Statewide Suicide Prevention Council, this is a cause I truly believe in. This Wednesday Senator Ellis and other legislators spoke at a luncheon for [Rural CAP](#), a statewide non-profit organization that works to improve the quality of life for low-income Alaskans. In his speech, Senator Ellis outlined his efforts to work towards energy solutions, substance abuse treatment and education improvements for Alaskans.

P.S. February 16th was [Elizabeth Peratrovich Day](#) in Alaska. The annual Elizabeth Peratrovich Day recognizes the [achievements of Peratrovich](#) and Alaska Natives across the state. Her 1945 speech to the Territorial Legislature is considered decisive in leading to the official end of segregation in Alaska, nearly 20 years before the U.S. Civil Rights Act.
