Tens of thousands of Alaskans from the Mat-Su to Girdwood were affected by power outages due to hundreds of downed trees and damaged transmission lines. Representatives from <u>Chugach Electric</u>, <u>MEA</u>, <u>ML&P</u>, and <u>ACS</u> testified and answered tough questions from committee members about the customer outreach, availability of information and response tactics in the event of future emergency situations.

I, like many Anchorage residents, found the initial response to the massive power outages unacceptable. I was encouraged to hear of the steps each individual utility is taking to mitigate future outages and ensure the public's safety.
